From the desk of the editor



My Dear friends from Packaging fraternity,

Let me take the opportunity to inform you that APF has been discussing in the Board Of Assembly meeting for quite some time about the introduction of CAPP and FAPP and finally, the executive committee of Asian Packaging Federation during their meeting held at Singapore on 1st April, 2016 has taken number of decisions including the introduction of new activity for the growth and promotion of packaging in the Asian region.

Most importantly, APF will be introducing a new activity to recognise the individual packaging professionals of the Asian region for their commendable contribution in the field of packaging. It is also decided that the packaging Professionals in the Asian

regions will be recognised in two levels which will be mainly based on the length of period of experiences of an individual and their contributions in the field of either in packaging education and research or packaging consultancy, printing and design or packaging production, engineering and marketing etc. The first and second level of recognitions will be termed as CAPP (Certified Asian Packaging Professionals) and FAPP (Fellow of Asian Packaging Professionals) respectively. An individual packaging professional of Asian region will be eligible to obtain this prestigious International recognition but the applicant need to undergo an evaluation process where every individual will be evaluated for their level of expertise and competency on a particular areas of packaging through a written examination based on a particular syllabus and the final evaluation will be done by the executive committee of APF based on the recommendation of core committee of CAPP and FAPP. However, it was also felt that the subject of packaging, being so complicated, complex and vast in nature, an individual packaging professional may not have the expertise in all areas of packaging. Due to this fact, it is decided that an individual professional will be recognised for his / her expertise in a particular areas of packaging like paper packaging, corrugated packaging, Plastic- flexible packaging, Plastic- rigid packaging, Glass packaging, Metal packaging etc and accordingly, the recognition title will also be awarded to the individual as CAPP (Paper Packaging or Plastic- flexible packaging and so on) or FAPP (Paper packaging or Plastic- flexible packaging, Plastic- rigid packaging

A comprehensive proposal is being prepared about the methodology of registration, syllabus and preparation of course materials for different areas of packaging, evaluation process etc for the implementation of this new activity which is expected to be launched by APF during the month of November, 2016.

I am confident that the introduction of this new activity by APF will definitely inspire and motivate the young packaging professionals of the Asian region to obtain this recognition with a title of CAPP and the Asian packaging Stalwarts will also be pleased for being awarded them with the title of FAPP.

Finally, I wish to express my sincere thanks to all the executive members of APF for their great contribution and active support for the promotion of packaging in the Asian region.

APF Meetings @ Hangzhou and Beijing, China

A Report



During the 64th Board of Administration and 40th General Assembly meetings of Asian Packaging Federation (APF) held at Istanbul, Turkey between 24th and 26th November, 2015, it was discussed that China Packaging Federation (CPF) being a founder member of Asian Packaging Federation has not been attending the meetings and also not participating in the ASIASTAR contest. All the members were highly concerned about the participation of China Packaging Federation (CPF). The members opined that China and India being large Nations in the Asian region, both the countries are required to be actively involved in the activities of APF for growth and promotion of the packaging industry in the Asian region.

Considering this, the Board Members took a decision unanimously that the newly elected

Meanwhile, it was observed that Mr. Yu, Chairman, Global Packaging Center (GPC), a leading packaging organisation is also closely



associated with China Packaging Federation as Mr. Yu is holding the responsibility as one of the Vice President of CPF. On account of this, the Board Members of APF requested Mr. Yu of GPC to coordinate with CPF and finalise the date for the meeting with the team of Asian Packaging Federation (APF) and China Packaging Federation (CPF).

In addition, GPC have also expressed their keen interest to be associated with the various activities of APF. Moreover, they have mentioned that GPC would like to invite the team of APF to their office at Hangzhou and discuss about the strategies for their active participation in various activities like ASIASTAR contest, Package Design conference, membership etc.

Accordingly, Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha, Secretary General of APF finalised the visit to GPC, Hangzhou. Dr. Jin Kie Shim, President, APF could not join in this important meeting due to his domestic problem. In absence of Dr. Jin Kie Shim, Ms. Annabelle Tan, 1st Vice President, APF visited Hangzhou, China and also attended the meeting along with Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha.

3rd March, 2016 (Thursday)

Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha, Secretary General, APF and Ms. Annabelle Tan, 1st Vice President, APF visited the office of Global Packaging Center at Hangzhou, China. Mr. Yu, Chairman, GPC took them around to show the facility of cloud design available at the office of GPC and also explained regarding their activities in the field of packaging. Subsequently, the team of APF had a detailed meeting with Mr. Yu and his team on the long-term association and co-operation for the improvement of ASIASTAR contest and also to organise an international packaging conference at Hangzhou.

Salient points discussed during the meeting are as follows:

- GPC being the associate member of APF expressed their views that they would be interested to host the next BOA and GA meeting of APF at Hangzhou in association with China Packaging Federation (CPF).
- GPC had also mentioned that they would be organising WPO Package Design and Technology conference in November, 2016 in association with WPO. Mr. Yu expressed that the APF meeting can be held during the same time so that most of the APF members can also attend the WPO Package Design and Technology conference.
- GPC also indicated that the venue of the APF events will be at the same venue of G-20 Summit which will be held in October, 2016 at Hangzhou, China.
- GPC also proposed that they would be interested to promote the ASIASTAR contest through the website of GPC. In addition, GPC is interested to conduct the package design contest in China with the support of APF.
- GPC has also shown their interest that the APF website can be professionally managed by GPC at their end. At present, APF Secretariat is not incurring any cost towards the maintenance of APF website. However, the matter would be discussed in the Executive Committee meeting.

Based on the discussions during the meeting, the Secretary General, APF mentioned that an Executive Committee meeting will be held at Singapore on 1st April, 2016 where the executive members as well as the active honorary members will be present. During the meeting, all the points covered by GPC will be discussed and accordingly, a final decision will be taken.

4th March, 2016 (Friday)

Saha, Secretary General and Ms. Annabelle Tan, 1st Vice President, APF along with Mr. Yu, Chairman, GPC visited the office of China Packaging Federation (CPF) at Beijing, China on 4th March, 2016 and a detailed discussion was held with Mr. Xu Bin, President, CPF and his team members.

The salient points discussed during the meeting are as follows:

- The meeting was also attended by Mr. Wang, Secretary General of CPF and other senior officials of CPF.
- Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha, SG, APF along with Ms. Annabelle Tan expressed their sincere thanks to Mr. Yu, Chairman, GPC for arranging the long-awaited meeting with CPF for their active participation in the activities of APF.
- Secretary General, APF highlighted that China and India being two big Nations in the Asian region, both the countries need to be very active in the activities of APF. He also highlighted that APF has been contributing to a large extent to WPO by way of sending more number of WorldStar entries. Hence, APF needs to be more strengthened with the support of all APF member countries, including CPF.

Mr. Xu, President, CPF warmly welcomed Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha and Ms. Annabelle Tan on their first visit to CPF.

- During the meeting, he assured that CPF will be very active in all the activities of APF

including participation in the ASIASTAR contest by way of sending large number of entries to APF Secretariat.

- APF team also invited the President, CPF to be a part of the Executive Committee by way of taking one of the positions as Vice President of APF. In that context, Mr. Xu mentioned that he, being an Official of the Government of China, will not be possible for him to take any such responsibility. However, he recommended that Mr. Wang, Secretary General of CPF will be very active in all the activities including taking the responsibility as Vice President of APF.

- It was also highlighted that GPC has been entrusted the responsibility to organise the National Packaging competition i.e. China Star on behalf of CPF and hence, GPC will be responsible to co-ordinate with APF Secretariat for sending large number of entries for the next ASIASTAR competition.
- Mr. Wang, Secretary General, CPF has also

- During the meeting, GPC will arrange the factory visit for the Executive Members of APF.
- GPC, in consultation with CPF, has also suggested the schedule as highlighted in Table 1 to organise the next BOA and GA meeting of APF at Hangzhou, China.

Based on the meeting and discussions with Mr. Xu Bin, President, China Packaging



Federation, Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha and Ms. Annabelle Tan expressed their happiness for their kind acceptance to be associated actively with the different activities of Asian Packaging Federation. More importantly, CPF has also shown their keen interest to organise the training programme on packaging in association with the Indian Institute of Packaging and other organisations of Asian region.

He has also mentioned that most of the points have been agreed by CPF and thus, the meeting was found to be more fruitful.

Conclusion

- Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha was nominated unanimously by the APF Board Members to represent APF as Secretary General to negotiate the various terms for the participation of Global Packaging Center and China Packaging Federation in the activities of Asian Packaging Federation.
- There has been a strange relationship of

China Packaging Federation with the Asian Packaging Federation for the last four years and Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha has been able to lead the team of APF to discuss in length with GPC and CPF and also sort out all the misunderstandings in order to establish a strong relationship between China with other member organisation of Asian Packaging Federation.

- China Packaging Federation agreed to organise the training programme on packaging in association with Indian Institute of Packaging. Moreover, they have expressed that they would prefer to purchase educational books on packaging published by the Indian Institute of Packaging.
- Visit of Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha to China as a leader of Asian Packaging Federation was highly fruitful in terms of building a strong position in the Asian region and also to establish a strong international linkage with China.

A Report



As per the decision taken in the 64th Board of Administration and 40th General Assembly meetings of Asian Packaging Federation held at Istanbul, Turkey between 24th and 26th November, 2015, the Executive Committee meeting of Asian Packaging Federation (APF) was held at Singapore on 1st April, 2016. Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha attended the meeting in the capacity of Secretary General of Asian Packaging Federation. He conducted the meeting along with Dr. Jin Kie Shim, President, APF.

The members who attended the meeting are as mentioned in Table 1.

Meeting Highlights

At the outset, Dr. Jin Kie Shim, President, Asian Packaging Federation and also the Director, Korea Packaging Center, South Korea welcomed the members and explained the objective of the meeting. Dr. Jin Kie Shim mentioned that in

6 Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha needs to send the proposal to APF with regards implementation of CAPP and FAPP under the responsibility of the Indian Institute of Packaging.

At the same time, there are many important issues which need to be sorted out on urgent basis. Hence, it was decided in the last meeting to have an Executive meeting to discuss the strategic planning for the growth of APF and also to discuss the modality to be adopted for the promotion of the packaging industry in the Asian region. Thereafter, he requested Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha, Secretary General, APF to proceed with the agenda.

Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha discussed the various

agenda points during the meeting. First, he made a presentation on his recent visit to China and also mentioned the outcome of the meeting with Global Packaging Center (GPC), Hangzhou and China Packaging Federation (CPF), Beijing.

The salient points discussed during the meeting are as follows:

- Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha mentioned that Global Packaging Center (GPC) was enrolled as Associated Member without voting right during the last BOA and GA meeting held

at Istanbul, Turkey. Mr. Yu, Chairman, GPC being the Vice President of China Packaging Federation (CPF) took the initiative of organising a meeting with the team of APF and the President, CPF.

- During the meeting with Mr. Yu, Chairman, GPC and his team members at Hangzhou, China, GPC conveyed their keen interest to participate in the various activities of Asian Packaging Federation including the management of APF website and hosting of next BOA and GA meetings.
- They also expressed that the next BOA and GA meeting is proposed to be held at Hangzhou, China between 25th and 27th October, 2016. However, it was mentioned by them that the meeting will be hosted by GPC in association with CPF.
- In this context, the members present in the Executive Committee meeting expressed their concern that CPF being the Executive Member of APF, it would be appropriate for CPF to host the next BOA and GA meeting. However, GPC might assist CPF to make the logistic arrangements and hence, it was decided unanimously that Secretary General will send a communication to the President and Secretary General of CPF to get in principle written approval for hosting the next meetings.
- In continuation, it was also decided that the proposed schedule sent by GPC for the next meeting needs to be confirmed by CPF as CPF will be the main host for the meeting. In fact, CPF is well experienced to organise the ASIASTAR judging and also the Board meeting as they have already hosted similar kind of event earlier. On the contrary, APF cannot accept the proposal that GPC will be the host of the event.
- Secretary General, APF also mentioned that GPC has submitted a tri-party agreement among GPC, CPF and APF for hosting the ASIASTAR judging and Board meeting. In this context, the members opined that with GPC and CPF being the members of APF and hence, there is no need for signing any kind of agreement or MoU.
- A detailed discussion was also held about the implementation of Certified Asian Packaging

Professional (CAPP) and Fellow of Asian Packaging Professional (FAPP) by Asian Packaging Federation (APF).

- In this context, the members opined that there is a need to have strict norms about the selection of the candidate for awarding either, CAPP or FAPP. Moreover, it would require large infrastructural facilities for the implementation of this project.
- Secretary General mentioned that in the long run, it would be advisable for APF to initiate this activity as this would enhance the credibility of APF, and at the same time, this would also create an avenue for revenue generation.
- After having detailed deliberation on these points, members have unanimously accepted that the Indian Institute of Packaging is the only Institute among the other member organisation of the Asian region of APF, who has large infrastructural facilities for conducting training programme as well as for organising this kind of CAPP or FAPP projects. In this context, it has been decided that Prof. (Dr.) N. C. Saha needs to do the groundwork and send the proposal to APF about the cost involved for the implementation of this project during the next Board meeting. Accordingly, APF would be interested to entrust the responsibility to Indian Institute of Packaging for the implementation of CAPP and FAPP on behalf of Asian Packaging Federation.
- In the same line, the Executive Members have opined that there are a number of countries in the Asian region like Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Indonesia where no packaging institute is available to provide formal education in the field of packaging. Due to this, it would be advisable for APF to sponsor at least two members from each country who can be trained

in India so that they would be in a position to conduct similar kind of programmes in their own country.

- In this context, members opined that APF Secretariat will contact the three institutions like Japan Packaging Institute, Thai Packaging Center and the Indian Institute of Packaging to take the details about the course curriculum, duration, eligibility criteria and cost along with the infrastructural facilities like hostel accommodation for conducting train-the-trainers programme. The same is to be submitted in the next Board meeting. Accordingly, the APF will take a decision to nominate the candidates from the individual member country of APF.
- Regarding membership of APF, the members opined that a new category as Corporate

Membership to be implemented so that leading packaging and FMCG companies can also be the Corporate Member of APF without voting right. It was also decided that the membership fee will be USD 1000.

- Regarding ASIASTAR contest, it was decided that there will not be any change in the trophy and trophy for Commercial entry will be made by the same vendor available at Seoul, Korea. However, there will not be any trophy given under Students category.
- APF Secretariat has recently revamped the entire APF website and a new website has been uploaded. The members have appreciated the efforts and given certain suggestions for the improvement of APF website.
- The meeting ended with the thanks to the chair.

LANKAPAK 2016 EXHIBITION & ANNUAL PACKAGING CONGRESS 2016



6th to 8th May, 2016

Sirimavo Bandaranaike Memorial Exhibition Centre

SUMMARY

Lankapak 2016 Exhibition was held for the 16th time at Sirimavo Bandaranaike Memorial Exhibition Centre (BMICH) 6th to 8th May 2016.

The Exhibition was declared open by Mr. Dharmatilake Ratnayake Past President, Sri Lanka Institute of Packaging, Former President of the Asian Packaging Federation, former, Vice President of the World Packaging Organisation and current Chairman of Packaging Development Center as Chief Guest and by Mr. M.A. Tajudeen, Additional Secretary of Ministry of Industry and Commerce as Guest of Honour.

The Diamond Sponsor M/s PCL Solutions (pvt) Ltd was represented by Mr. Thushantha Karunanayake and the Gold Sponsor M/s CMC Engineering Export GmbH was represented by Mr. Micheal Perera. Ironically it was noted that Mr. Micheal Perera had participated in the all 16 Lankapak exhibitions held so far by the institute.



There was more than 100 Exhibition stalls occupied. This is a 45% growth as compared to last exhibition held. Total of 68 companies from the packaging industry took part in the exhibition. This comprise of 63 exhibitors from the industry and 5 complimentary exhibitors representing,

1. Sri Lanka Institute of Nano technology
2. Sri Lanka Institute of Printing (Department of Government Printing)
3. Sri lanka Print Media Academy (SLAP)
4. Ingrin Institute of Printing and Graphics
5. University of Moratuwa

If we analyse the participants, there were two direct foreign companies and many other foreign companies were participated through their local agents.

Companies representing the Corrugated packaging, Paper, Carton and Label Printing, Flexible Packaging, Rigid Plastic conatiners, Glass bottles, metal Containers and related packaging materials participated. The Companies related to the Packaging namely Packaging Machinery and material suppliers such as Paper, board, films, inks, chemicals and other ancilleries also participated. On the demand side many packaging users was also participated.

If we analyse the size of the businesses participated in the exhibition, the break-up will be as follllows,

Large Enterprices – 40 %

Small and Medium Enterprices – 60 %





VISITORS AND RESPONSES TO THE EXHIBITION

We received an extremely positive response from the local businesses using packaging materials. We had more than 3029 visitors.

These numbers also showed a growth of 15 %. The exhibitors expressed their satisfaction about the visitors they received.

They claimed that they had opportunities to make new contacts with potential customers and also renew relationship with existing customers. These new contacts will lead to improved sales in the coming months.

Exhibitors were happy with the responses and proposed we should hold this exhibition every year. More than 50% exhibitors confirmed their participation next year too.



RELATED EVENTS

On 5th May 2016 we held a Packaging Congress inviting a large cross section of the industry, academia, and regulatory and technology providers to make presentations and issues faced by the industry. We held this congress under the theme “Packaging for sustainable economic development” and had 12 other eminent speakers on trends in materials, technologies, machinery and processes, package design and issues related to sustainability and environments.

The Responses for the congress was overwhelming from the industry and we had more than 140 participants registered for the congress. 116 were paid participants and other 24 were complimentary tickets given to sponsors and council of Management (SLIP) members.

Panel of speakers had 5 foreign speakers and Mr. Henky Wibawa who represented APF is also the an ex-Executive director of Indonesian Packaging Federation.





IRAN

REPORT OF IRANIAN INSTITUTE OF PACKAGING

The Second International Festival of Leaders in Packaging Industry with the approach of sustainable employment was held in 2016 by Iran Packaging Industry Policy Council in partnership with Iranian Institute of Packaging (IRIP) from May 30 to June 2 on the permanent site of Iran International Exhibition co, Tehran, Iran.

This festival consisted of 4 different sections: festival, lateral exhibition, packaging design contest, and workshop.

It started on May 30 in the conference hall of the exhibition with 250 attendances including activists in private and state sectors, designers, and active masters in packaging industry of Iran. In this festival, IRIP hosted Mr. Keith Pearson, the general secretary of WPO. After IRIP membership in WPO in May 2015, in Italy, and in APF in October 2015, in Turkey, by the help of these two global and regional organizations, it has become possible for IRIP to take great steps in achieving its goals in networking, and international communication development much stronger and faster than ever before.

There were lots of speakers in from private and state sectors in the festival. The president of the Iran Packaging Industry Policy Council, Mr. Aghamohammadi stated that Iran government supports packaging industry in order to provide better life for its people through industrial growth and export promotion. He also added that IRIP has a long way ahead to achieve its goals, so all the plans have to support this idea; and of course this industry has to see the task as a set of different stages from designing the pattern of a package to gathering the refusals to be recycled.

He mentioned in another part that IRIP is trying to attract up-to-date technologies of packaging industry in its professional meetings and exhibitions but to make it localized with respect to Iranian ethnic culture. Packaging now makes 2 to 5 percent of our production. Now that Iran is getting ready for higher economic growth, and tries to increase its export, the packaging has to grow here. Otherwise exporting is not possible. So Iran has to think about packaging before thinking about growing its production.

General Secretary of WPO mentioned in his lecture that IRIP had had significant improvement since his previous trip to Iran last year; and emphasized on WPO support for its programs. He stated that there are very good potentials for packaging industry in Iran which need proper organizations to synergize it. And finally he said that Tehran Packaging Exhibition showed that packaging industry is on its way to grow and its policy is approved by WPO.

At the same time of his presence in Iran, a contract was signed between IRIP and Omid Entrepreneur Fund (financial institute) to establish a packaging school by IRIP with financial support of Omid Entrepreneur Fund.



IranStar packaging Award 2016 is the first designing contest in Iran with WPO indexes and criteria. 220 designs were received in the field of marketing and idea for professionals, and 15 designs from student participants, among which 3 designs were chosen in the marketing field, 3 in idea and 1 for student design. A certificate and award was given to each winner and they would go for future AsiaStar and WorldStar.

Packaging technology workshop will be on August 2016, under the supervision of Pierre Pienaar, WPO vice president, and cooperation of AIP, and it is of course supposed to be continued with more advanced courses.

As a final world, it is necessary to thank all the members of WPO and APF for all their helps and collaborations.

USE PACKAGED MILK FOR HEALTH

Making a statement about the 21 May World Milk Day, Turkish Packaging Manufacturers Association (ASD) President Mr. Sadettin Korkut said, "Milk is consumed in very low quantities in our country and about 40% of the consumed milk is "open milk", which may cause numerous diseases".

Korkut stated that there was a general belief among the public that "raw milk is more natural and healthy", and added that the milk sold open was not subjected to any supervision and control at all.



Adopting "Making food available to the consumer safely" as its mission, the Turkish Packaging Manufacturers Association (ASD) drew attention to the dangers relating to milk, which is considered a "perfect food" because of its nutritional value. ASD's President Mr. Sadettin Korkut said:

"Milk, which is not pasteurized and which is not packaged, is always risky. When it is heated too much, it loses most of its nutritional value. We must increase our awareness about milk and dairy products which are consumed by everyone. The milk whose source and method of preservation we do not know or we cannot control poses a great threat for our health. In order to protect our health, packaged milk and dairy products, which carry accurate information on their packages, must be preferred."

CONSUMERS PREFER RAW MILK SOLD ON THE STREET

Korkut said that consumers in many regions of Turkey preferred open milk believing that it was "healthier", and added, "We must question the source of the open milk, which is widely consumed all around Anatolia, and which is brought to the consumers' doors in big cities.



We must realize that open milk which is purchased may lead to health concerns. The percentage of under the counter production in milk and dairy products has reached almost 40%. Food safety requires hard work and investment. Big and reliable companies can afford such investments. You should stay away from milk and dairy products which are sold in the open and at sales points which do not have any refrigerators."

ASD President Korkut warned that the consumers had to be careful about the milk they consumed. Korkut said: "When buying packaged milk, those carrying labels must be preferred. Foods sold in unlabeled packaging are very risky. This is one of the greatest problems that we face in relation to milk sold without any supervision. It is estimated that 500 tons of open milk is sold every day in Istanbul. We see so-called "natural milk" sold on the street, or at the market, which are put in unsuitable boxes which are not fit for purpose. Avoiding products not properly registered is the first prerequisite for healthy food consumption. Remember, we should insist on consuming products which were produced by companies licensed by the Turkish Ministry of Food and Livestock, and which are presented in packaging that conforms to legal standards. As we always say, the packaging of the food you buy is its safety. The label on the packaging states its contents. For a healthy nutrition, the products whose packaging bears correct information must be preferred, particularly if it is a dairy product. We invite our public to be more sensitive and careful about this matter."

Korkut states that, when we compare our milk and dairy products consumption with developed countries, we see that we still have a long way to go. The annual milk consumption is above 100 liters in Ireland, Finland, UK and Iceland. However, it is about 24 liters in Turkey. And only 15 liters of this amount is consumed in the form of packaged and processed regular milk. An average Turkish individual consumes only 66 grams of milk on a daily basis."

Dairy production did not change much from 2014 to 2015. The total dairy production which was 18,630,859 tons in 2014 increased by only 0.1 and realized at 18,655,000 tons. Of this production, 90.8% was cow milk, 6.3% was sheep milk, 2.6% was goat's milk, and 0.3% was water buffalo milk.

21 MAY WORLD MILK DAY

With the decision of the International Dairy Federation, 21 May was established as the World Milk Day in 1956 and it has been celebrated by all member countries since then. As a result of the decision of the Turkish Ministry of Food and Livestock, 21 May the World Milk Day and 21-25 May World Milk Week have been celebrated in our country since 1991, and various activities have been organized with a view to raise public awareness about milk, and to help children at school age adopt the habit of consuming milk.

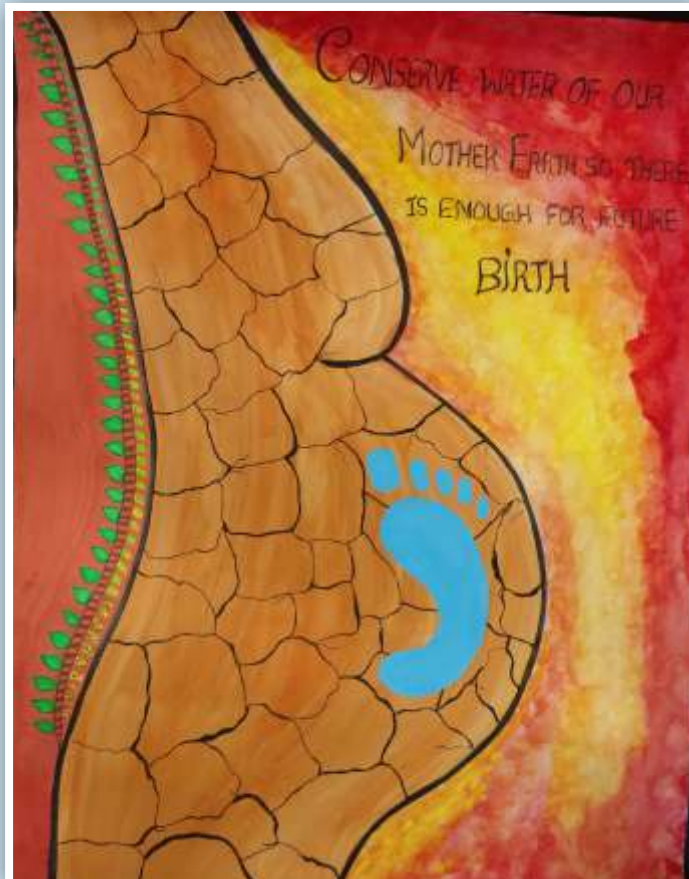

GOVERNMENT OF INDIA HAS BANNED POLYCARBONATE FOR THE MANUFACTURING OF FEEDING BOTTLE

Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), the National body for the formulation of standards in India has reviewed the presence of BPA (Bisphenol A) in the polycarbonate material which might cause as endocrine disrupters to the new born baby who uses the feeding bottle. As per the literature study, it is observed that though there is no scientific evidence that proves that the BPA has got harmful effect to the human health. However, it is found that more than 30 countries across the world has banned the usage of polycarbonate for the manufacturing of feeding bottle as a preventive measures.

In line with this, the national body of standards in India has also revised the standard by banning the usage of polycarbonate for the manufacturing of feeding bottle as a preventive measures. The new standards has been made effective from 20th February, 2016.
